Position Overview

The Athletic Training Intern supports the Athletic Training & Medical Director in ensuring the health, safety, and performance readiness of corps members throughout spring training and summer tour. This role provides hands-on experience in a high-performance touring environment and offers direct mentorship under licensed medical professionals.

The Intern works under the supervision of the Athletic Training & Medical Director and collaborates closely with the Traveling Athletic Trainer and Traveling Nurse.

Key Responsibilities

1. Injury Assessment Support

- Assist in daily evaluation of corps members' physical condition.
- Support the implementation of rehabilitation exercises and recovery protocols as directed.
- Observe and participate in injury care under appropriate supervision.

2. Injury Prevention

- Assist with taping, bracing, stretching routines, and preventative care strategies.
- Support strength, conditioning, and mobility initiatives.



- Reinforce education on proper warm-up, cool-down, hydration, and recovery techniques.

3. Emergency Response Support

- Assist medical staff during rehearsals, performances, and travel events.
- Support execution of the corps' medical emergency action plan under supervision.

4. Record Keeping

- Assist with maintaining accurate and organized medical documentation.
- Ensure injury reports and treatment logs are updated in collaboration with supervising staff.

5. Communication

- Communicate clearly with the Athletic Training & Medical Director regarding member concerns.
- Maintain professional boundaries and confidentiality at all times.
- Collaborate respectfully with instructional staff and administrative leadership.

6. Logistics & Operations Support

- Assist with organizing medical supplies and equipment across tour sites.
- Help prepare treatment areas before rehearsals and performances.
- Support daily setup and teardown of medical stations during tour moves.

Qualifications

- Currently enrolled in or recently graduated from an accredited Athletic Training program (Bachelor's or Master's level).
- CPR/AED certification required.
- Strong interest in sports medicine, performing arts medicine, or high-performance environments.
- Ability to work long hours in outdoor conditions (heat, sun, travel demands).
- Professional demeanor and strong communication skills.
- Ability to work effectively within a team-oriented, fast-paced touring environment.
