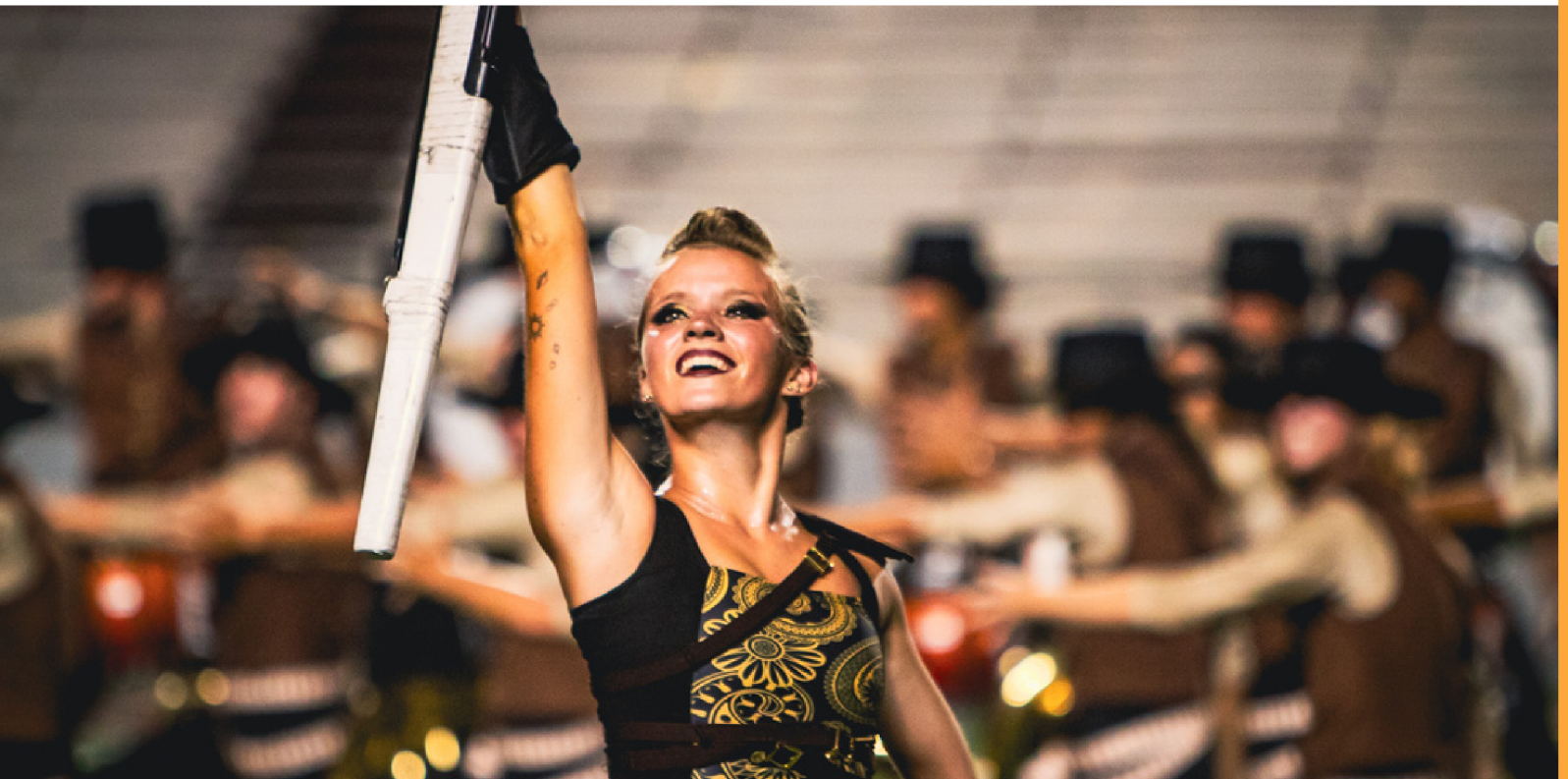
## AN OPPORTUNITY FOR YOUR STUDENTS

- Our members will be extremely courteous and exercise the utmost care for your facility.
- We will leave your facility better than we found it.
- We go out of our way to be as self-sufficient as possible so as to not disrupt regular operations at your school throughout the remainder of our stay, although an assigned contact will be needed.
- While the Troopers is a 501c3 Non-Profit Organization, we do understand that there may be pricing considerations for our stay. While we do appreciate the opportunity for you hosting us cost free, we do acknowledge that some venues may not be able to accomodate these requirements at no cost. We are prepared for that reality if necessary.

## WHAT WE NEED FROM YOU

In order to complete our logistical planning, we will need the following information by or before April 15th

- The name of your housing site
- Housing site address
- The primary contact's name, phone number and email address
- The name and contact information for your venue's Principal and/or head administrator



## FACILITY ACCOMMODATIONS

As you consider housing the Troopers, please take into account the size of our organization. The Troopers will be traveling with:

- 165 marching members
- 4-6 management staff
- 20-30 instructional staff
- 10-20 support staff & volunteers
- 7-11 drivers

## OUR FLEET

- Up to two 53ft equipment tractor trailers
- One 53ft tractor trailer food truck
- Up to six coach buses (when on tour)
- One pickup truck with attached trailer
- Up to two support vehicles (passenger van or Suburban)

\*Note: Food Truck will need to park and have available access to a clean water and electrical hookup for the duration of our stay.





## SLEEPING, SHOWER, RESTROOM ARRANGEMENTS

- A high school or large middle school gymnasium to accommodate the 165 marching members
- One large band/choir room or four average sized classrooms for the 20-30 instructional staff
- A minimum of three average-sized classrooms for management and support staff
- A minimum of five average sized classrooms for drivers. These rooms need to be isolated, dark, quiet and cool to allow for proper rest during daylight hours.
- Upon arrival, it is imperative that the sleeping accommodations be immediately available
- A minimum of 10 working shower heads per locker room.
- A minimum of two sets of separate restrooms (not including the locker rooms) throughout the facility

## REHEARSAL SPACES

- Two to three full sized artificial turf fields or well-kept grass fields (300' x 160') during spring training
- One to two full sized artificial turf fields or well-kept grass fields (300' x 160') while on tour
- Indoor space for colorguard rehearsal. A gym or field house if available
- Access to two to three large indoor or covered outdoor spaces in case of inclement weather (this can include the gym, auditorium, cafeteria etc.)
